Dan Kommeth



Women Walking West "Her Words: A Storytelling Competition"

The "Her Words" Essay Writing Contest was crafted as a platform for participants to weave captivating narratives that delve into their personal journeys—chronicling their origins, navigating challenges, articulating aspirations and dreams, reminiscing about their home country, highlighting proudest accomplishments, and envisioning their futures. Twenty-nine inspiring and powerful stories were submitted and our panel of judges chose three winners and selected two for honorary mention.

Congratulations to all the participants for taking on this challenge! Please enjoy a brief overview of the winners' essays:



First Place Winner: Dillys Jinui Fongong received a \$750 cash award. She notes that "receiving this scholarship is not only a tremendous financial relief for me, but it also serves as a powerful motivation to continue my academic pursuits and achieve my goals. Thank you for believing in my potential and for investing in my future." She comes from a family of educators and after experiencing harrowing challenges she arrived in the US at the age of 17 to attend Miami University. She is currently a nursing student at Sinclair Community College and conducts research at Miami University.



Second Place Winner: Glorie Akuzwe received a \$500 cash award. She is a social work major at Sinclair. One of her favorite things to do is volunteer. She said: "I love being able to pour love into my community. I believe that leadership isn't about directing or controlling people. True leaders are people that work for the people they serve." Glorie comes from the Democratic Republic of Congo, where she experienced a lot turbulence due to war and poverty. She is currently a student at Sinclair Community College and says: "I love learning new things and college is the best place to do so. Even though this is my first semester at Sinclair, I love it so far; I love attending class. I am proud of my enthusiasm for learning and for striving for a better life."



Third Place Winner: Stephany Ortega Gomez received a \$350 cash award. Stephanie's motto is: "if you reach the heart you stay in the mind". She was born in Cali, Colombia. She has a degree in Social Communication and Journalism from the Universidad Autónoma de Occidente in Colombia. Currently, she is a psychology major at Sinclair Community College. In her essay she writes: "I have the gift of not forgetting important dates, although sometimes I wish I only remembered the ones marked with a laugh. But I suppose that life is also about remembering those dates that are marked with a tear. Because? Because that's when I start to bloom." Her greatest inspiration is her family.



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
